Program Overview

- Repair and resurface streets damaged by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita
- Funded by FHWA Emergency Relief program and administered by DOTD
- Must be on Federal-Aid System map
- Eligible roads identified by local government agencies



Program Overview

- Candidate roadways must meet FHWA rehabilitation requirements
- Rehabilitation is patching, milling and overlaying driving surface to improve rideability; not reconstruction
- Initial parishes include Orleans, St. Bernard and Jefferson



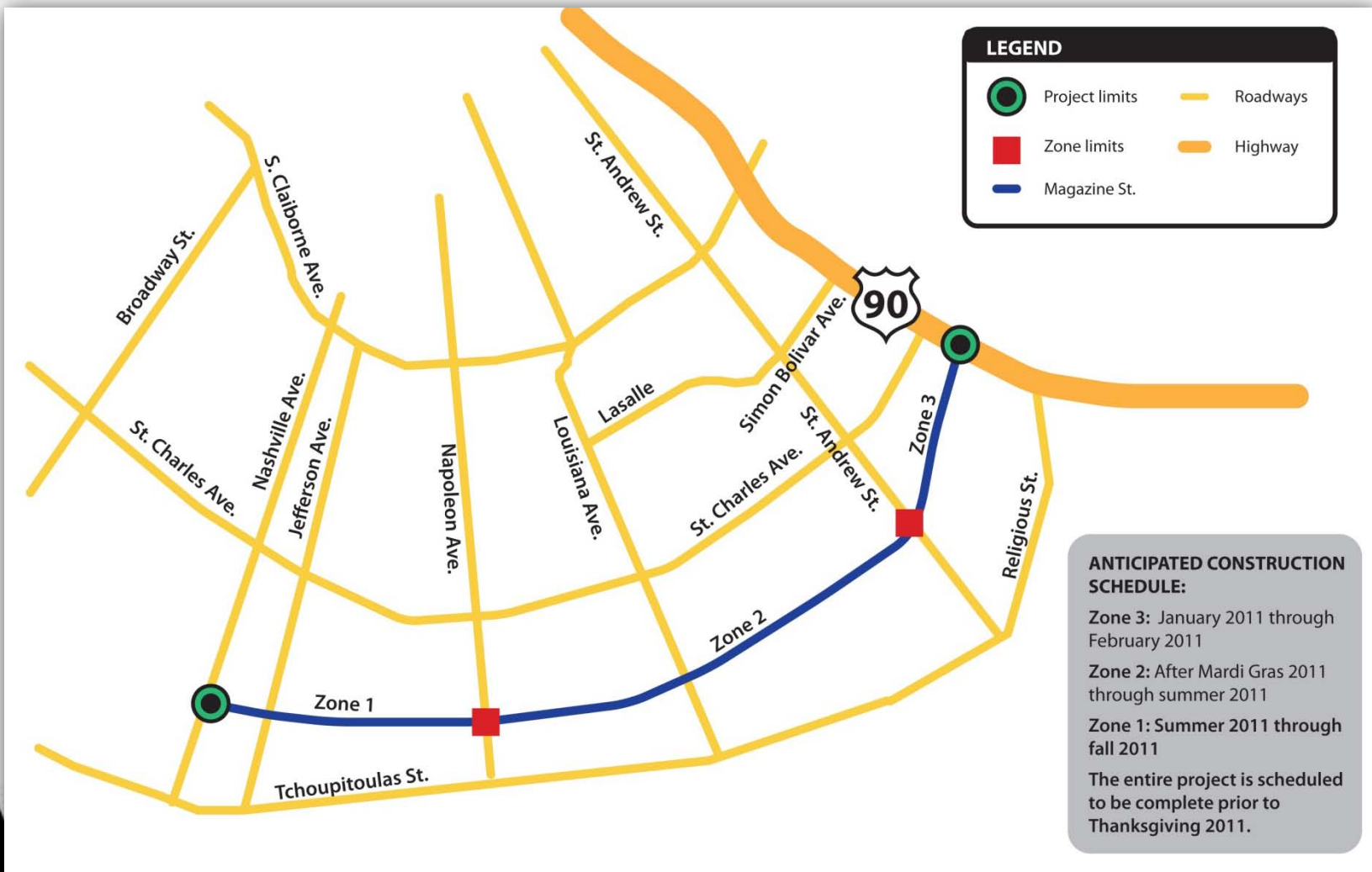
Agency Collaboration

- **Unprecedented agency partnership:**
 - FHWA
 - LA DOTD
 - RPC
 - Parishes
- Coordinate utility improvements with S&WB, Entergy, AT&T, etc.
- Coordinate traffic impacts with City of New Orleans and RTA





Magazine Street (US 90B – Nashville Avenue)

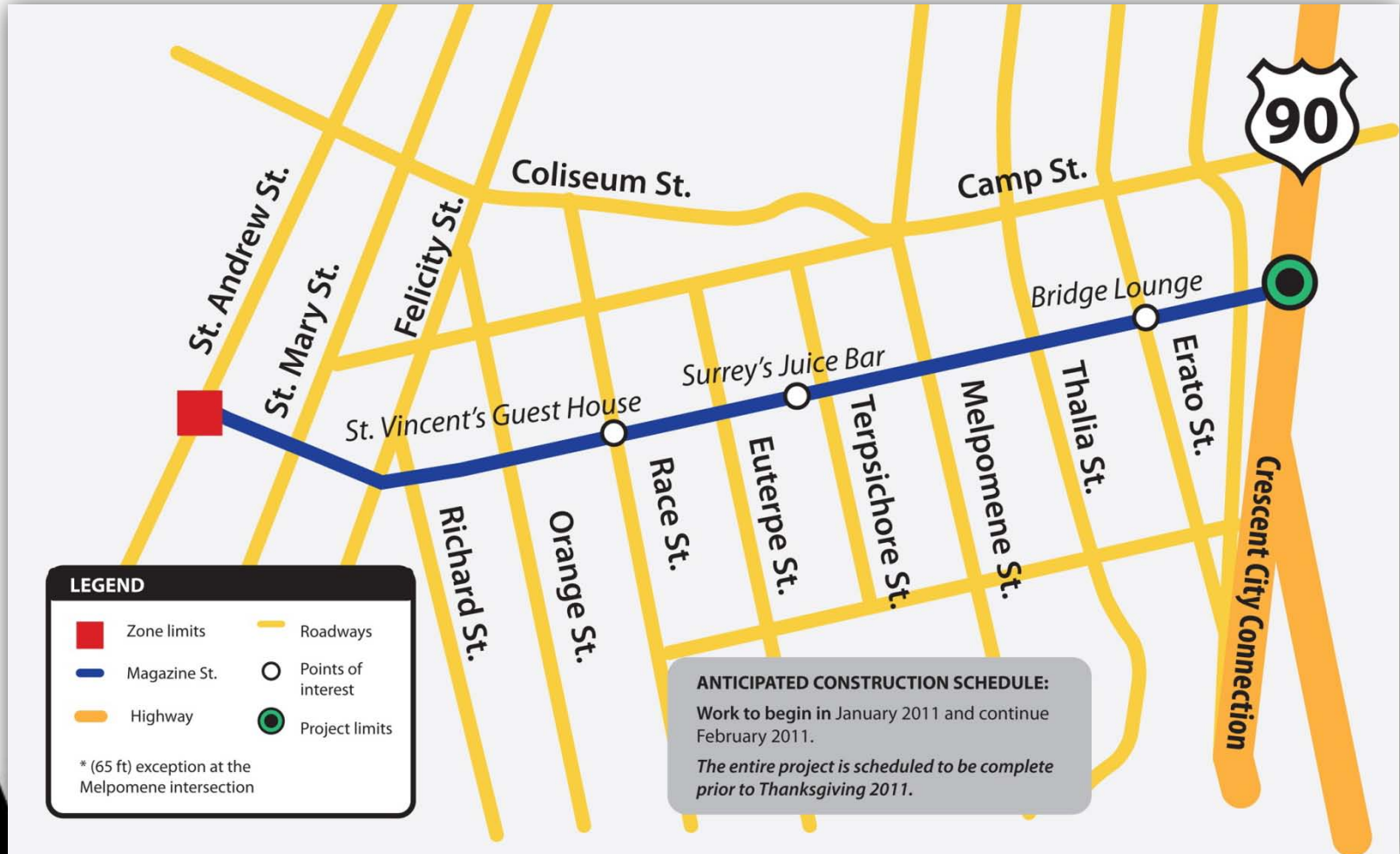


Magazine Street Repair Work

- **Zone 3:** From US 90B to St. Andrew Street (*0.68 miles*)
 - Construction to last from January 2011 to Mardi Gras
- **Zone 2:** From St. Andrew Street to Napoleon Avenue (*1.79 miles*)
 - Construction will begin after Mardi Gras
- **Zone 1:** From Napoleon Avenue to Nashville Avenue (*1.05 miles*)
 - Construction to last from summer 2011 to fall 2011

What's Happening on My Street?

- Patching damaged sections
- Remove 2" of old asphalt pavement
- Curb repair where needed
- New 2" asphalt pavement overlay
- ADA (handicapped access) curb ramps and sidewalk tie-ins
- New striping and markers
- Fixing failed drainage/ pipes as needed



Construction Details

- Repairing and improving riding surface, not reconstruction
- At least one lane open to traffic
- Flagmen and police will be present, as necessary
- Work will take place in 1-3 block increments, depending on conditions



Work Schedule

- Daytime working hours: 7 am – 5:30 pm
- “Noisier” activities during the day
 - Jackhammering
 - Sawcutting
 - Removing non-compliant ADA ramps / breaking concrete



Work Schedule

- Nighttime working hours: 9 pm – 5 am
- “Less noisy” activities at night
 - Pouring concrete for ADA ramps
 - Cold milling / laying asphalt
 - Patching asphalt
 - Bus pad repairs
 - Back-up alarms on trucks
- Lights will provide a safe area for workers
- Standard noise-muffling devices on equipment



Work Schedule

- Contractor will try to limit major activities during rush hour
- Workers will still be present on site and preparing for nighttime activities from 5:30 to 9 pm
- Contractor will only work Friday and Saturday evening activities with City permission
